
2. Privacy Policy — DocCount (Spain / GDPR, Draft)

Last updated: 1 December 2025

This Privacy Policy explains how DocCount, operated by **Sergio Damián Capdevila**, collects and uses personal data when you use the DocCount application.

1. Data Controller

The controller of your personal data (under GDPR) is:

2. Scope

This policy applies to:

- Visitors using the **public site** and **sandbox mode**.
- Users who **sign in** and create an account.
- Communications related to DocCount (e.g. transactional emails, product updates).

It does not apply to third-party websites or services that you may access through links from DocCount.

3. Personal Data We Collect

3.1 Account and Identity Data

- **Email address** (required to create and use an account)
- Basic auth metadata from Supabase (e.g. user ID, timestamps)

If you sign in using Google or another provider, we may receive certain basic profile information from that provider (e.g. email, name), depending on your settings with them.

3.2 Usage and Earnings Data

When you use DocCount we store:

- **Categories** you create (name, rate, type, icon, etc.).
- **Counts and time tracking** entries.
- **Daily and monthly earnings** derived from your usage.
- App settings, such as theme and display preferences.

This information is necessary to provide the core functionality of DocCount.

3.3 Technical and Analytics Data

We may collect:

- IP address and approximate location (at city or region level).
- Browser type and version, operating system, device type.
- Pages visited, time spent in the app, clicks and interactions.

This may be collected via:

- **Vercel Analytics** or similar tools.
- Built-in Supabase logging and monitoring.

We use this data to understand usage and improve the product.

3.4 Communication Data

If you contact us or complete surveys / feedback forms, we may collect:

- Your email address.
- Your message or feedback.
- Optional details you choose to share (e.g. what you use DocCount for, requested features).

We do not ask you to provide sensitive categories of data in feedback.

4. Data in Sandbox Mode (No Login)

In sandbox mode (when you do not sign in):

- Your data is stored **only in your browser** (localStorage).
- We do **not** receive or persist this data in our database.
- If you clear your browser storage or use a different device, your sandbox data may be lost.

We may still collect limited technical data (e.g. aggregated analytics) as described above.

5. Purposes and Legal Bases (GDPR)

We process your personal data for the following purposes:

1. **To provide the service (DocCount app)**

- Creating and managing your account.
- Storing your categories, counts, and earnings.
- Displaying the dashboard and analytics.
Legal basis: Article 6(1)(b) GDPR — performance of a contract.

2. **To operate and improve DocCount**

- Monitoring performance and usage.

- Debugging and preventing errors.
- Developing new features.
Legal basis: Article 6(1)(f) GDPR — legitimate interest (running and improving the service).

3. To communicate with you

- Transactional emails (e.g. login links, security notices).
- Replies to your support or feedback messages.
Legal basis: Article 6(1)(b) and 6(1)(f) — contract and legitimate interest.

4. Optional product updates or marketing (if you opt-in)

- Occasional emails about new features, changes, or resources.
Legal basis: Article 6(1)(a) — consent (you can withdraw at any time).

5. Security and compliance

- Detecting and preventing abuse or attacks.
- Keeping logs for security and legal purposes.
Legal basis: Article 6(1)(f) — legitimate interest, and where applicable Article 6(1)(c) — legal obligation.

6. Data Sharing and Processors

We do not sell your personal data.

We may share personal data with trusted **processors** who help us provide DocCount, such as:

- **Supabase** (database, authentication, storage).
- **Vercel** (hosting, deployment, analytics).
- **Resend** (transactional email delivery).
- Other similar service providers strictly necessary for hosting, logging, or analytics.

These providers process data on our behalf and under our instructions. We ensure they offer appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect your data.

We may also share data when required by law or to protect our rights, users, or the public (e.g. responding to a lawful request from authorities).

7. International Data Transfers

Some of our service providers may be located outside the European Economic Area (EEA), for example in the United States.

When we transfer personal data outside the EEA, we will:

- Use providers in countries with an adequacy decision by the European Commission, **or**
- Put in place appropriate safeguards, such as **Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs)**.

You can contact us for more information about these safeguards.

8. Data Retention

We keep personal data only for as long as necessary for the purposes described above.

- **Account data:** kept while your account is active. If you delete your account, we will delete or anonymize personal data within a reasonable period, subject to legal retention obligations.
- **Earnings and usage data:** kept while you use DocCount. You can choose to delete categories or data from within the app (if such features exist) or by requesting deletion.
- **Analytics data:** kept in aggregated or pseudonymized form where possible.
- **Communication data:** kept as long as necessary to manage our relationship with you and for record-keeping.

We may keep some information longer if required by law (for example, for tax or accounting reasons).

9. Your Rights (GDPR)

If you are in the EEA or under GDPR, you have the following rights:

1. **Right of access** – to know if we process your data and to obtain a copy.
2. **Right to rectification** – to have inaccurate or incomplete data corrected.
3. **Right to erasure (“right to be forgotten”)** – to request deletion of your personal data in certain cases.
4. **Right to restriction** – to limit processing under certain conditions.
5. **Right to data portability** – to receive your data in a structured, commonly used format, and to transmit it to another controller where technically feasible.
6. **Right to object** – to object to processing based on legitimate interests or direct marketing.
7. **Right to withdraw consent** – where processing is based on consent, you can withdraw it at any time.

10. Cookies and Local Storage

DocCount uses:

- **Cookies** set by Supabase and our hosting provider for authentication and session management.
- **LocalStorage** in your browser to:

- Provide sandbox mode (no login).
- Store certain preferences.
- Store a small offline cache in authenticated mode (as described in the app).

We do not currently use invasive tracking cookies or third-party advertising cookies.

You can control cookies through your browser settings, but disabling certain cookies may affect the functionality of DocCount (e.g. ability to stay signed in).

11. Security

We take reasonable technical and organizational measures to protect your personal data, including:

- Using HTTPS to encrypt data in transit.
- Using Supabase for secure authentication and database storage.
- Applying **Row Level Security (RLS)** policies so users can only access their own data.
- Implementing input validation and rate limiting to reduce abuse risks.

However, no system is completely secure. You are responsible for:

- Using a strong, unique password for your email (for Magic Link logins).
- Keeping your devices secure.
- Informing us promptly if you suspect unauthorized access.

12. Children

DocCount is not intended for children under 16 and we do not knowingly collect personal data from them.

If you believe we have collected personal data from a child under 16, please contact us and we will take steps to delete that data.

13. Changes to This Privacy Policy

We may update this Privacy Policy from time to time, for example when:

- We add new features.
- Our data practices change.
- Laws or regulatory guidance change.

When we make changes we will:

- Update the “Last updated” date at the top, and
- Where appropriate, notify you via in-app notice or email.

Your continued use of DocCount after the new policy becomes effective will mean you accept the updated policy.
